Fabric Corsage Workshop with Sally-Anne Thompson

You will need:

- Pieces of medium / lightweight fabrics
- Narrow elastic bands
- Buttons
- Scraps of card
- Scissors
- (Optional floristry wires, blank cards and envelopes, safety pins, ribbons)

Method:

- 1. Cut some templates from scraps of card 4/5" circles and squares.
- 2. Draw around the templates onto a range of fabrics or cut freehand if you prefer.
- 3. Tweak the edge of the fabrics if you like a frilled edge.
- 4. Select 4 or 5 pieces of fabric and layer them one on top of the other.
- 5. Place a button in the centre of the layers.
- 6. Gather up the fabric, enclosing the button.
- 7. Secure the button in place by wrapping an elastic band around snuggly.
- 8. Gently pull out each layer to open out the 'bud' into a full bloom.

Use to adorn presents, decorate greeting cards, attach to ribbon for a wrist corsage/ bag charm or attach to floristry wire to make a stemmed fabric flower.
